PUBLIC COMMENT POLICY:

Citizens are encouraged to address the City Commission during regularly scheduled meetings. This policy is intended to provide some guidelines to ensure that all El Dorado citizens have a chance to address the Commission.

1. Each citizen will state their name and address before making comments.
2. There are no residency requirements.
3. Each citizen will have 5 minutes to present his or her comments.
4. An extension of time, if necessary, may be approved but must be by a majority of the City Commission.
5. Comments or questions will be directed only to the City Commission.
6. Citizens will follow the decorum policy.
7. Debate or argument between parties in the audience will not be allowed.
8. Certain legal issues may not be discussed. (Examples include but are not limited to personnel issues, lawsuits, etc.)
9. Violation of this public comment policy will result in the citizen being directed to cease or resume sitting.

3. Distribution Of Liquor Taxes And Court Fees

BACKGROUND

Annually the City distributes money to Non-Profit Organizations through the collection of liquor taxes and court fees.

Liquor Tax Program

During 2015 the City received \$74,199.58 in Liquor Tax Revenue; \$37,099.80 was allocated to the General Fund and \$37,099.78 to the Special Parks and Recreation Fund. One-third of the revenue allocated to the Special Parks and Recreation Fund, \$12,366.59, is for the Liquor Tax Program.

The balance as of 12/31/14 available for the liquor tax program was \$20,457.48. At

the City Commission meeting on 2/16/15 for the 2015 budget, the Commission allocated \$13,000 to be given to Non-Profit Organizations leaving an ending balance of \$7,457.48. The total available for 2016 Liquor Tax Program is \$19,824.07 (\$12,366.59 + \$7,457.48).

The City has received applications for this money and the applications are included for your review.

Court Fee Program

The municipal court began collecting fees for this program in December 2009. During 2015 the City received \$5,359 in Court Fee Revenue.

The balance as of 12/31/14 available for the court fee program was \$7,178.50. At the City Commission meeting on 2/16/15 for the 2015 budget, the Commission allocated \$5,500 to be given to Non-Profit Organizations leaving an ending balance of \$1,678.50. The total available for 2016 Court Fee Program is \$7,037.50 (\$1,678.50 + \$5,359).

The City has received applications for this money and the applications are included for your review.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Allocate the money as indicated in the staff report.

NECESSARY ACTION

Allocate the portion of the liquor tax money in the Special Parks & Recreation Fund and a portion of the court fees in the General Fund to the requesting organizations as the City Commission desires.

5. Comprehensive Plan Amendment – Connect 2025

BACKGROUND

The City of El Dorado began the Connect 2025 planning process in September of 2014. The latest version of the Connect 2025 Plan is the product of numerous meetings of the Parks Advisory Committee, survey feedback from residents, input from staff, and several community meetings.

The Planning Commission conducted a public hearing on November 19th, 2015. At the meeting, the Planning Commission voted 5-4 to recommend approval of the El Dorado 2030 Comprehensive Plan amendment. The Planning Commission minutes are attached for your review.

POSSIBLE ACTIONS

1. To approve the recommendation of the Planning Commission. This requires a motion to accept the recommendation and the passage of an Ordinance.
2. To return the issue to the Planning Commission for further review. Requires only a simple majority.
3. To overrule the recommendation of the Planning Commission. This would require that at least 4 City Commissioners vote to override the recommendation.
