CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Vince Haines called the August 17, 2016 Special City Commission meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Nick Badwey moved to recess into an Executive Session for the purpose of discussing matters pertaining to non-elected personnel, and to reconvene the regularly scheduled meeting in the City Commission room at 5:15 p.m.

Commissioner Chase Locke seconded the motion.

Motion carried 4 – 0.

Mayor Vince Haines called the meeting back to order at 5:15 p.m.

PARKS AND RECREATION MASTER PLAN DISCUSSION

Parks and Recreation Director Kevin Wishart stated that staff would like to move forward with the master plan. In order to do so, questions regarding priorities, scope/scale, timeline and funding must be answered.

Each member voted on their priorities and the following list was developed:

1. Aquatic Center - \$7 million
2. Ball Fields - \$1.5 million which adds 4 fields and a restroom
3. Tennis Courts - \$800,000 6 courts
4. Activity Center - \$3 million for 2 courts, lockers, restrooms and concessions
5. R.I.O. Park – Tabled until the first two items are decided upon.

The City Commission stated that they will begin working on a sales tax committee and develop a ballot question for consideration in spring of 2017.

ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Chase Locke moved to adjourn the meeting at 7:19 p.m.
