SALES TAX COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

The City Commission discussed the recommendations of the Sales Tax Committee and decided on the following: USD 490 will not receive the \$16,000 recommended for the trail, the Library will only receive \$3,000 of the \$5,000 they requested, and staff will return with a recommendation for the use of the \$18,000 that is now remaining.

The City Commission also requested that the Elks Lodge funds be included in the discussion on MOU's with partner agencies at a future work session.
