NEW BUSINESS

KANSAS MODERATE INCOME HOUSING PROGRAM

City Engineer Scott Rickard stated that the City has been awarded funding from the Kansas Housing Resources Corporation (KHRC) for the Kansas Moderate Income Housing Program in the amount of \$190,000.00. The next step is to authorize the City Manager to sign the grant agreement with the KHRC. He stated that the City and El Dorado Inc. will be working on ways to advertise the award so that they can distribute the money.

Commissioner Gregg Lewis moved to authorize the City Manager to sign the Grant Agreement with the Kansas Housing Resources Corporation for the Kansas Moderate Income Housing Program.
